In December, Rubber Man's Club will be hosting the Christmas Dinner as part of the London Club's Together Christmas Dinner Weekend.

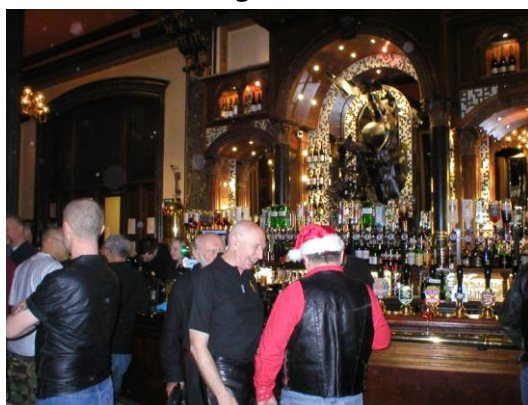
Subscriptions for 2011
